

COMMUNITY-BASED SUPPLIERS

The City of Cape Town is committed to working with citizens and groups within communities to find sustainable ways of meeting their social, economic and material needs as well as improving the quality of their lives.

A community-based supplier is a supplier of goods, services and/or construction works who:

- lives and operates in a specific area or community;
- meets the criteria for community-based suppliers as determined by the Director: Supply Chain Management from time to time; and
- is registered on the City's supplier database and at his/her respective subcouncil.

A community-based project involves quotation specifications, provided by line departments or district offices, for general maintenance, repairs, goods or services, and is allocated in a specific ward. Subcouncil managers identify and confirm the location and residential address of all community-based suppliers within their area, inviting them to submit applications to become suppliers for the City of Cape Town. The names of these suppliers are verified on the master database as maintained by Supply Chain Management.

Implementation of community-based projects The City's drive to afford smaller companies and individuals an opportunity to provide it with identified services below R30 000, includes but is not limited to:

- Waste removal
- Cleaning of parks
- Catering
- Laundry and hygiene
- Area cleaning
- General maintenance
